ABOUT THE PRELUDE: The hymn *Christ unser Herr zum Jordan kam* (Christ Our Lord to Jordan Came) was written by Martin Luther in 1541. In this setting by Bach, the melody is heard in the pedals while the constant swirl of notes in the left hand suggests the flowing waters of the Jordan River.
